

lameron Hometown, Texas

Cameron was established as the permanent county seat of Milam County by the First State Legislature in May 1846. The town was named for Captain Ewen Cameron, a Scot Highlander prominent in the Texas Revolution and a member of the Mier Expedition during the war with Mexico. The town of Cameron was a small village before Sam Houston liberated Texas in the Battle of San Jacinto. In 1881, the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railroad constructed a line through Cameron connecting the Gulf Coast with Fort Worth. Another railroad, the San Antonio and Aransas Pass was completed in 1890 increasing the population and adding impetus to the agricultural economy of Cameron and the surrounding territory.

A small town in the rich agricultural area of Milam County, Cameron was settled by diverse groups of pioneers in the 1840's. It is not unusual to hear Czech, German and Spanish-mingled with distinctive Texas drawls-still being spoken by some of Cameron

Milam County, named for Texas patriot and independence fighter Ben Milam whose statue is on the courthouse grounds in historic downtown Cameron, was created in 1836 as one of the original 23 counties of Texas. The first settlers in Milam County were primarily from Kentucky, Tennessee and Louisiana, coming to the county in 1834.

Come explore Cameron's area historical markers or take a historical walking tour of downtown Cameron.

HISTORIC SITES

Magnolia House

Is a fully restored Victorian house, which was the home of prominent citizens in Cameron for over a century. Built in 1895, it has won the Great American Home Award from the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The Texas Historical Commission has called it "the finest home of its size and type in the country.'

The Bridges of Milam County

Some of the county's 100-plus steel bridges from 1900 era are still in use today. Brushy Creek Bridge once spanned Bushy Creek south of Thorndale, was moved to Cameron's Wilson-Ledbetter Park. A bridge over Little River by Sugar Loaf Mountain is still in use.

El Camino Real de los Tejas National Trail

The El Camino Real de los Tejas National Trail goes through Milam County and Cameron. Come visit the sites and historic locations.

Cemeteries

Milam County's cemeteries provide a look into the past in this historic county.

"Old Town Cameron Railroad Museum"

A 1940's miniature of the town and model railroad was created by Cameron resident John Johnson, who fell in love with his hometown at an early age. Visit www.mcrm.org

Local artists helped capture our heritage and preserve it on the walls of some of our downtown buildings.

Milam County Historical Museum

The Milam County Historical Museum, located at 112 W. 1st, houses many exhibits and artifacts of early Milam County. The restored Milam County Jail c.1895, located at 205 E. Main, is complete with cells, shackles, and gallows tower along with other exhibits of tales of our history, such as pioneer farm and ranch equipment, rustic household furnishings, Spartan "fashions" of the frontier, Indian artifacts, cowboy gear and more.

"Wilson-Ledbetter Park" One of Nine Parks to Visit in Cameron A lush and beautiful 25-acre city park with picnic areas, hike & bike trails, large pond with ducks, site of historic Brushy Creek Iron Bridge, and a Bird Sanctuary with many migrating species in spring and fall. The Texas Historical Commission recognized the park to have a significant part of Texas history.

Rockdale, Texas is at the intersection of U.S. Highway 79 & 77, & Farm roads 908 & 487. In 1873, George Green, B. F. Ackerman & Frank Smith sold 400 acres of land to the International-Great Northern Railroad, which was laying track from Hearne to Austin. A sale of town lots was held on September 3, 1873, & the track was completed to Rockdale in early February 1874. The new town was named by Mrs. B. F. Ackerman for a rock, which was twelve feet high & had a circumference of twenty feet. The rock was adjacent to the road just outside Rockdale on Hwy 77. The town of Rockdale claims its beginning as 1874. It was incorporated in 1878 & established an aldermanic government. The first major railroad town in Milam County, Rockdale quickly developed as a shipping & supply point for area farmers, who produced cotton, wool, vegetables, fruits, grain, hides & livestock. By 1884 Rockdale had 1700 residents, five churches, two schools, two steam gristmill-cotton gins, a 250-seat opera house, a private bank, a weekly newspaper & other assorted businesses. Lignite coal was found by state geologists in 1867. By 1870, Herman Vogel established the Vogel Mine which was a slope mine located on the east side of Rockdale, close to the International Great Northern railway. By 1895 six coal mines were in operation. Each mining area had a camp, store & saloon. Hispanics fleeing the Mexican Revolution came to the Rockdale area & were employed in these mines. Mining became an industry to the area & two Rockdale residents served on the Texas State Mining Board: E. A. Camp & N. M. Bullock. By 1914, Rockdale was shipping 7,000 railroad cars of lignite coal every week.

A shallow oil field was discovered near Rockdale in 1920 prompting the establishment of an oil refinery on the outskirts of the city. The growth of oil & natural gas between 1920 & 1940 undercut lignite in the energy market. Rockdale lost most of its leases & ceased to mine until lignite became more viable as an energy source. In the early 1950's the Aluminum Company of America discovered a way to use lignite to generate power to produce aluminum. The industry revitalized the area's economy & attracted many new residents to Rockdale. Rockdale's population grew from 2,300 to 6,300 by 1958.

Rockdale, as a part of Milam County, has had inhabitants living here for as far back as 10,000 years ago when

Indians roamed this area of Texas. By the 1600's as many as twenty-seven Indian tribes were known to live & roam this area. By 1691 Spanish Explorers & Mexican Misssionaries of the Catholic faith explored the area just 8 miles northwest of Rockdale. In the mid-1700's three Spanish Missions & a Presidio were built on the south bank of the San Gabriel River. These missions lasted only three short years due to famine & drought in the area. Rockdale is 8 miles north of the El Camino Real de los Tejas National Trail. Though the missions no longer stand, Apache Pass, a crossing known to the Indians, explorers, pioneers & the settlers who chose to make this area their home is still on the San Gabrial River for all to

Thorndale, Texas.

Thorndale is an incorporated community on U.S. Highway 79 and Farm Road 486, twelve miles west of Rockdale in southwestern Milam County. It was established in 1878 about three miles west of its present site, shortly after the International-Great Northern Railroad was built through the area. A railroad employee named the town after the region's abundant thorny vegetation-mesquite thorn, prickly pear, and sagebrush. A post office, a store, and a hotel opened in Thorndale in the late 1870's. In 1880 the store was sold and moved east to the present site of the community on the railroad, and eventually the other businesses moved as well. By 1884 Thorndale had a church, a school, and 130 residents. The local economy was largely agricultural, and Thorndale served as a shipping and supply point for area farmers. In 1903 it had a two-teacher school for sixty-six students, and in 1913 the Thorndale Independent School District was formed. In 1929, the year in which Thorndale decided to incorporate, its population was reported as 1,500, but the onset of the Great Depression reduced the number of residents to about 1,000 by 1931, and it had fallen to 851 by 1952. During the mid-1950's, however, the population began to grow again, possibly because of the construction of an aluminum plant at nearby Sandow. For the next three decades the community grew steadily, and reported 1,338 residents and sixteen businesses in 1988. In 1990, however, its population fell to 1,092. The population was 1,278 in 2000.

Moody Museum

This boyhood home of Texas' youngest Governor, Dan Moody, boasts many artifacts and furnishings that are original to the home. Tours of this historic property are every Sunday from 2 to 5 pm.

Liberty Garden

Members of the military, police and fire departments and emergency services personnel have purchased and continue to purchase - engraved pavers with the names of military service men lead to a stately bronze eagle. This garden, located in Murphy Park, offers visitors time for quiet reflection.

Murphy Park

Beautiful historic homes dot the landscape of Taylor. The Conservation and Heritage Society estimates more than 1,000 homes in Taylor are historic.



NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

There is a National DO NOT CALL Registry managed by the Federal Trade Commission. The National Do Not Call Registry gives you an opportunity to limit the telemarketing calls you receive. Telemarketers have up to 3 months to stop calling after you have registered. It is enforced by the FTC, the FCC and state law enforcement officials. Numbers remain on the list for five years following registration. Register online @ www.donotcall.gov.

TEXAS STATE WIDE DO NOT CALL LIST

Residential users, you may add your name, address and telephone number to state-sponsored "No Call Lists," which will help limit telemarketing calls to your home or business. You can choose to register a residential telephone number for one or both of two "No Call List" sponsored by the Public Utility Commission (PUC>)

STATEWIDE "DO NOT CALL" LIST

The first list, a statewide "Do Not Call List," will apply to any telephone marketer, including Retail Electric Providers, calling a Texas residential phone number. Your registered residential telephone number(s) will remain on this list for three years. If you register via Automated Registration, at 1-866-896-622, or mail in your application, there is a registration charge of \$2.25 for each residential phone number to be included in this list only. You may register online at no charge.

Cell phone numbers may now enroll for the statewide "Do Not Call list"

"ELECTRONIC NO CALL LIST"

The second list, initiated from electric restructuring legislation, has been created to prevent calls only from Retail Electric Providers (REPs) and telemarketers calling about your electric services. Both residential and business numbers can be registered for the "Electric No Call List." Cell phone numbers may now enroll for the "Electric No Call List". Numbers placed on this list will remain on the list for five years. If you register using the Automated Registration at 1-866-896-6225 or mail your application, there is a charge of \$2.25 for each number placed on the "Electric No Call List". You may register online at no charge. All telemarketers operating in Texas must use this list. You may register by one of the following methods:
