BILLING & PAYMENTS

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YOUR TELEPHONE NUMBER IS IMPORTANT

When your telephone number is preceded by your Area Code, it is the only one like it in the United States and Canada. When leaving your telephone number for someone else to call you, be sure to include the Area Code.

Numbers are the most easily understood if they are given to others as "Area Code 3-1-1 (pause) 5-5-5 (pause) 3-6-2-1." When writing your telephone number, separate it like this: Area Code 311 555-3621.

TEACH CHILDREN EMERGENCY TIPS

If you have children, teach them how to use a telephone in emergencies. They should know how to call their home phone number, operator, and 911. Use a toy phone for practice, or hold down the hook on your regular home telephone while the children practice dialing. See page 4 for more tips.

DISCONNECT OF TELEPHONE SERVICE FOR NON-PAYMENT

Written notice of our intent to disconnect telephone service is mailed to a customer at least five days before the scheduled disconnect date. If a written request from a resident subscriber is on file in the local business office at the time of disconnect notice is mailed, five day notification will also be sent to the County Department of Health and Social Services.

TO OBTAIN THE ASSISTANCE OF AN OPERATOR

If you need assistance in completing a call or if after several attempts you fail to complete your call, dial "0" Operator. When the operator answers, explain the situation to the operator, who will be glad to assist you. A charge may apply.

DIRECTORY ERRORS

The Telephone Company is not liable for damages arising from errors or omissions from its directory, except in cases where a specific charge has been made for a listing, and the liability of the Telephone Company shall not exceed the amount of such charges.

USE OF RESIDENCE SERVICE FOR BUSINESS PURPOSES

Residence Service is installed with the understanding that it will be used for normal social or domestic purposes. A Residence Service will be changed to business service if used primarily or substantially for business purposes, or if the residence telephone number is advertised in connection with the sale of products or services, and the subscriber has no business elsewhere within our system.

LISTINGS

Baldwin LightStream customers can have their telephone number listed or they can choose from non-listed or non-published numbers. A non-listed number is not in the directory, but is available through directory assistance. A non-published number is not in the directory and is not available through directory assistance. A small monthly charge applies for the non-listed or the non-published service.

ADDITIONAL LISTINGS

If the telephone is not in your name, but you want to be listed in the telephone directory, we can help. For a small monthly charge you can have an additional listing. An additional listing must be ordered by primary account holder.

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TELEPHONE TIPS

ANNOYING CALLS? HERE'S WHAT TO DO.

- DON'T TALK. Don't keep talking to the caller. What the caller wants is an audience. Don't be that audience.
- HANG UP. Hang up if the caller doesn't say anything. Hang up at the first obscene word. Hang up if the caller doesn't give satisfactory identification.
- 3. IF OBSCENE OR HARASSING CALLS CONTINUE. We're concerned about these calls and want to help stop them. Should you receive any, remember, you control your phone. You can end any conversation simply by hanging up. If the calls continue, contact your law enforcement agency. We work with the law enforcement agencies in the apprehension of these callers. With the help of improved procedures, many persistent callers have been caught. We want you to know we're doing all we can to preserve your right to privacy. Keep a call log.

BE CAUTIOUS

GENERAL INFORMATION

Teach children and baby sitters to be cautious with unknown callers. Instruct them not to provide information such as, "Mr. and Mrs. Smith are out of town." Instead, simply tell them to take a message — using pencil and paper you provide in advance. And don't forget to leave the phone number where your sitter can call you.

TELEMARKETING CALLS

If you are not interested when someone calls, just cut in and say no. If you do not want other calls from that company, ask them to take your name off their list.

NOTICE LOCATION OF BURIED FACILITIES FOR DIGGERS AND EXCAVATORS

It is the policy of Baldwin LightStream to locate its buried facilities within its exchange area without charge to anyone planning to do digging or excavating in the exchange area.

When digging, if no request for location is made, and the facilities are damaged or made inoperative, the person or firm doing the digging or excavating will be responsible for the entire cost of the damage incurred.

In accordance with Wisconsin State Law (Statute 182.0175) a request for location of buried facilities must be made by the individual(s) or firm doing the digging "not less than 3 days prior to the start of the excavation or "demolition."

When a request has been made for the location of buried facilities in accordance with the above requirements and the request is not responded to, any damage which occurs to the buried facilities shall be the responsibility of the company having failed to locate its buried facilities.

All charges for relocating or rearranging buried facilities located on private rights-of-way will be borne by the individual, firm or company requiring the change.

Any person who knowingly fails to comply with this section...shall forfeit \$1000 for each such failure, provided that if the failure to comply results in damage to any transmission facility, the forfeiture shall be \$2000. Each day that failure to comply persists is a separate offense.

TENDED COMMUNITY CALLING

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EXTENDED AREA SERVICE (EAS)

(Dial Direct-Toll Free)

EAS is your local calling area. Calls placed to communities within your EAS are included in your local telephone charges (not toll charges) and require dialing the 10-digit telephone number. Baldwin (715) 684 & 688, Woodville (715) 698, and Hammond (715) 796 customers can call from one exchange to another without paying toll charges.

EXTENDED COMMUNITY CALLING (ECC)

ECC Calls-Extended Community Calls are not "local" calls, nor are they considered "long distance." ECC was created by the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin. ECC allows customers to call people in adjacent telephone exchanges as well as people within 15 miles of the central office headend, even if the exchanges are not adjacent, without paying normal long distance charges. The PSC created this program to allow customers to call schools, government, medical facilities and other areas of local interest without paying the normal long distance charges.

To place an ECC call requires dialing the 10-digit telephone number. ECC calls are billed at a special reduced rate of \$.05 per minute. See the boxes at right for the ECC areas from your exchange.

ECC calls are bulk billed on your phone bill showing total minutes used at \$.05 per minute. You can receive an itemized billing of your ECC calls by calling our business office at 715-684-3346. There is a \$3 per month charge for itemized billing.

However, some customers may have a special calling plan from their carrier in which they want to include their ECC calls. To include ECC calls on your main carrier billing (i.e. Sprint, MCI or AT&T) you must dial your ECC calls using the following method. Dial: 10+1+XXXX (Carrier Code*) + 1+ 715 + the number you wish to dial.

*Carrier Codes are displayed on your billing from your carrier or can be obtained from your carrier by calling the customer service number on their billing.

CALLING AREAS (LATA)

The shaded area of this map shows the Northwest **IntraLATA** calling area.

IntraLATA calls are sometimes referred to as "local long distance" calls. They are long distance calls to locations within the Northwest LATA. Rates for these calls are determined by the long distance carrier of your choice.

InterLATA calls are long distance calls to locations beyond the Northwest LATA of Wisconsin. Rates for these calls are by the long distance carrier of your choice.

Baldwin LightStream offers Equal Access connection for Intra and Inter LATA calls. This means you can choose the long distance provider for these services. See pg. 8 for more information on Equal Access.

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EQUAL ACCESS

Your local Telephone Company provides the connection that lets you make long distance calls.

Today, many companies can handle those calls. Baldwin LightStream offers Equal Access service that lets customers of any participating long distance company call conveniently.

Equal Access service allows you to select the participating long distance company of your choice and access that company's service just by dialing 1 plus the area code plus the 7-digit number.

If you occasionally wish to use the service of a long distance company other than the one you selected for Equal Access, contact the company for special dialing instructions.

Each long distance company has different rates and offers different services. To find the rates or services for your primary long distance company or any other company you wish to use, contact the company directly.

ONG DISTANCE CALLING

To verify your selection of InterLATA long distance company dial 1 + 700 + 555-4141.

You may change your primary long distance company by contacting a Baldwin Light-Stream Service Representative. You may change long distance companies at any time and as often as you wish, however there is a charge each time you change.

PIC FREEZE

A pic freeze is something you can add to secure your long distance service. A pic freeze on your line means that a long distance provider cannot switch your long distance carrier to them without your permission. This does not mean you cannot change carriers, but it allows Baldwin LightStream to call you before we implement any changes. Call today to order this free service.

BILLING

Some long distance companies have arranged for Baldwin LightStream to bill calls made over their networks on your local phone bill. In other cases, billing for long distance calls will be mailed directly to the customer by the long distance company used to place the calls.

CASUAL CALLING

"Casual Calls" are calls placed using any company other than the primary long distance company you selected. This procedure will allow you to take advantage of rates and services from other companies without changing your primary long distance company. Calling Card, 900, Third Number Calls, etc. may be included. To make casual calls, dial 10 plus the 4 digit Equal Access Code for the long distance company you wish to use and then dial the number you are calling. Rates and fees for casual calls vary by carrier.

CALLING PLANS

Each long distance company has its own calling plans. Contact your long distance carrier for more information.

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Wisconsin Relay Makes Telecommunications Accessible for Nonstandard Phone Users



What is Wisconsin Relay?

Wisconsin Relay is a free, completely confidential 24-hour public service that makes the use of the telephone possible and a better experience for many thousands of citizens and visitors of the state who are deaf, hard of hearing, deafblind, speech-disabled, and hearing.

How does Wisconsin Relay work?

The person dials the toll-free Wisconsin Relay number and gives the communications assistant (often abbreviated as the CA) the area code and number of the person receiving the call. An example of a Wisconsin Relay service is a highly trained CA who voices the typed comments by the TTY (text telephone) user and types the spoken comments by the other person back to the TTY user. Wisconsin Relay provides several options to meet the needs of people who do not use the standard telephone.

* Some buildings with a PBX telephone system (often in hotels and offices that have extension numbers) make reaching 7-1-1 not possible. The above 800 numbers can be dialed when not able to get through to 7-1-1.

CapTel®-a free captioned phone service

CapTel, short for captioned telephone, users place calls in the same way when dialing with a standard telephone. Utilizing voice recognition technology that displays verbatim captions of the conversation on screen of a telephone or computer screen, the CapTel user can hear and read what the other person is saying.

How do I apply for specialized telephone equipment?

The Telecommunications Equipment Purchase Program (TEPP) provides qualified applicants (proof of a disability that makes using a standard telephone difficult or impossible) with vouchers to purchase assistive telephone equipment. A person can apply for a voucher by visiting www.wisconsinrelay.com/tepp or calling 1-800-251-8345 (TTY in state only) or 1-608-231-3305 (Voice).

7-1-1 is not an emergency number

Some people might assume it is okay to call 7-1-1 for emergencies. The 7-1-1 Wisconsin Relay number is for relay service calls only. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires that 911 centers be prepared to handle emergency calls from people who use the text telephone. Wisconsin Relay will make every effort to assist a person during an emergency but cannot serve in the same function as 911 centers. Wisconsin Relay does not assume responsibility for handling emergency calls.

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Wisconsin Lifeline

Lifeline is the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) program to help make communications services more affordable for low-income consumers. Lifeline provides subscribers a discount on qualifying monthly telephone service, broadband Internet service, or bundled voice-broadband packages purchased from participating wireline or wireless providers. The discount helps ensure that low-income consumers can afford 21st century broadband and the access it provides to jobs, healthcare, and educational resources.

With FCC reforms, the Lifeline program has been streamlined, and eligible customers are now limited to one wireline or wireless phone or Broadband Internet Access Service (BIAS) per qualified household.

The Lifeline Program provides a reduced monthly rate for telephone or BIAS service (subject to speed tier minimums). The current speed tier minimum for BIAS service is 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload. Lifeline subscribers who wish to have their credit applied to BIAS must subscribe to this minimum speed per FCC rules.

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DIRECT DISTANCE DIALING

DIRECT DISTANCE DIALING CALLS are station-to-station long distance calls you dial yourself without operator assistance. You must dial all 10 digits when making a local or long distance call within your area code.

When the operator comes on the line, state the type of call you are making.

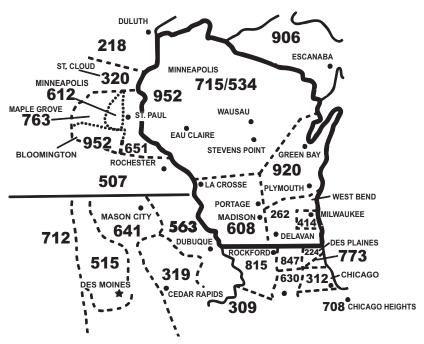
For an additional service charge, the operator will place the following types of calls:

- Busy Line Interrupt. The operator interrupts the conversation on a busy line to say you are calling.
- Collect Calls. The person or firm you are calling agrees to pay for the call.
- Conference Calls. To talk with several people at the same time. For conference service, contact your long distance company.
- International Calls. You can usually direct dial or your long distance company operator can handle the call, including information.
- Person-To-Person Calls. The operator will only complete the call to the person or extension you request. If you do not reach the right person or extension, you will not be
- Third-Number Billing. You bill the call to a phone other than the one you are calling to
- Third-Number Billing From A Public Phone. The operator will call the number you are charging. If no one answers or accepts the charges, you will have to make other billing arrangements.
- Time And Charges Call. Inform the operator in advance that you want to know the length and cost of your call. Stay on the line after the call.
- Automated Operator-Assisted Calls. When placing a collect or third number call, recorded announcements will help you select the type of call and billing you desire. An automated voice will announce your call, if required. If the charges are accepted, your call will be connected.

If you experience Trouble On Your Call, Hang up. Then pick up the phone again and dial "0" for an operator. Explain the situation so the operator can help you, or issue a credit for a wrong number on local or long distance calls.

Be Certain You Dial the Correct Area Code

If you reach a wrong number

or have any other trouble with your call...dial "OPERATOR" immediately and provide the area code and the telephone number reached, so the necessary billing adjustments can be made.

You will not be charged

- If the telephone number you dial is busy or does not answer.

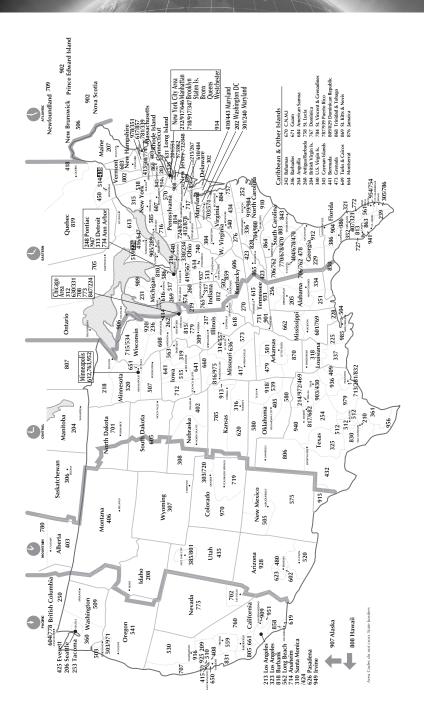

INTERNATIONAL CALLING

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DIALING INSTRUCTIONS

International calling is more convenient today than ever before. Calls can now be dialed to many overseas countries by customers throughout the United States. The following instructions are for placing international calls.

STATION-TO-STATION CALLS

To dial international calls, dial in sequence:

- 1. The International Access Code 011.
- The Country Code a two or three digit number.
- 3. The City Code a one-to five-digit number.
- 4. The local telephone number.
- 5. The "#" button where telephone is equipped with the Tone Dial dialing.

For example:

To place a call to Frankfurt, Germany, to telephone number 123456, you would dial:

Internation Access 0	 Country Code 49 12345	++	City Code 69 #
	Local number		button if Tone Dial dialing*

^{*}Tone Dial dialing saves additional time by using this step.

Dial the International Access Code (011 or 01) without pausing between digits. If you hesitate 3 seconds or more after dialing "0", you'll get your local operator.

Signals (ringing, number busy, etc.) in other countries often differ from those in the United States.

After dialing an International Call, allow at least 45 seconds for the ring to start.

OPERATOR-ASSISTED CALLS

To dial person-to-person collect,* credit cards and billed to a third number international calls, follow the instructions given above but use 01 for the International Access Code. After the call is dialed, the Operator will come on the line to ask for information such as the name of the person you are calling or your credit card number. Rates are higher than station-to-station calls.

ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE OR INFORMATION

Dial "0" (Operator) if you need assistance:

- To obtain a telephone number you don't know.
- To obtain City Codes not listed in this section.
- 3. For help in completing a call.
- For credit on a call on which you had difficulty, e.g., reached a wrong number.

*Certain countries will not accept collect calls.

TO PLACE A CALL TO THE BAHAMAS, BERMUDA, CANADA,MEXICO,* PUERTO RICO AND THE VIRGIN ISLANDS

Calls to these points and most other Caribbean points can be dialed in the same manner as long distance calls within the United States. Simply dial "1" plus the appropriate Area Code and the local number. International rates apply.

*Mexico City and certain border points.

INTERNATIONAL CALLING BLOCK AVAILABLE

An international call block is available to block international calls from being dialed from your phone. To implement this free service, call our business office and speak to our customer service representatives. You must also call your long distance provider to implement the block.

INTERNATIONAL CALLING CODES

To find listings for Country and City Codes you can access many different online sources* such as: www.the-acr.com/codes/cntrycd.htm

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BILLING ERROR RIGHTS

Telephone numbers that begin with 900 or 976, allow customers to access certain information and entertainment services including sports scores, stock quotes and live group conversations. There is always a charge for accessing these services.

In response to public concern over possible misuse of these services, customers have certain rights and obligations with respect to charges for 900 or 976 calls. To avoid problems, you may want to consider 900/976 Call Blocking. This service enables your phone to automatically block all calls to 900 and 976 numbers. Please contact our office to receive this service.

Charges for 900 and 976 pay-per-call services appearing on your phone bill are for non-communication services and should not be billed for any such service that does not fully comply with the appropriate federal laws and regulations. If you are charged for 900 or 976 calls, and you feel these charges are erroneous, there is a procedure to dispute these charges.

If you think you have been incorrectly billed for a 900 or 976 pay-per-call service, you must notify your local telephone company within 60 days of the bill date and request an investigation of the charge. There is no need to write: a phone call is sufficient.

During an investigation, you are not required to pay the disputed amount, nor will you be charged for the investigation. If you were incorrectly billed, or your claim was not handled properly, an adjustment will be made to your account. If, after an investigation, it is determined that you were properly billed, you will be responsible for the charges and actions may be taken to collect any outstanding sums.

900 & 976 NUMBERS

INFORMATION AND ENTERTAINMENT LINES

Companies called information providers offer sports updates, stock quotes, live group conversations, horoscopes, legal advice, and other entertainment or information services for a fee. 900 numbers are advertised on television, in magazines and newspapers and passed around by word of mouth. 900 services are created by program sponsors that determine the message content and set the charges for each call. These services can be reached by dialing telephone numbers that begin with 1-900, 1-976, or 1-700. Baldwin LightStream is not affiliated with these companies.

900 & 976 CALL BLOCKING SERVICES

For those customers concerned about message content or possible excessive use of 900 lines, Baldwin LightStream offers 900/976 Call Blocking at no initial charge to you.

This Call Blocking Service allows you to block ALL calls to 900 and 976 numbers. We cannot selectively block some of these calls while allowing others to be completed. To arrange for Call Blocking, call our business office at 715-684-3346.

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Baldwin LightStream offers many custom calling services. Please call us if you would like to subscribe.

Home Intercom

Turn your phone into a home communications system.

How it works:

Use your phone to talk with someone in another part of the house, garage, workshop, or barn-wherever there's an extension. A special ring lets you know it's an intercom call.

To Use:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Dial your own phone number. You'll hear a confirmation tone or a recorded message indicating that you've dialed your own number.
- 3. Hang up.
- 4. Listen for the phone to ring, You'll hear a special ring for a Home Intercom call. The phone will stop ringing when someone picks up an extension.
- 5. Lift the handset and you'll be connected.



Call Forwarding

Let your call follow you to another number.

How it works:

You can program your calls to ring at another number. Each time a call is forwarded, your phone will make one short ring. It can still be used to make outgoing calls.

To "turn on" the service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *72. (On a rotary phone, dial 1172.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- 4. Dial the number where you want your calls forwarded.
- 5. When the phone is answered, your Call Forwarding is in effect.

If the line is busy, or there is no answer:

- 6. Hang up.
- 7. Within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4 above. You'll hear a confirmation tone, to let you know your Call Forwarding is now working.

To "turn off" the service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *73. (On a rotary phone, dial 1173.)
- 3. Listen for the confirmation tone, then hang up. Your Call Forwarding is now "off" and calls will ring normally on your phone.

To change the "forward to" number:

- 1. Turn off Call Forwarding.
- 2. Repeat steps 1-5 above to turn on Call Forwarding, entering the new "forward to" number.

Note: Dial the number exactly as if you are calling directly. For all calls, dial "1" plus the area code. Or if you have speed calling, you may dial one of your codes instead.

Communicating at the speed of "CLICK"

Call Waiting

You'll know when another caller is trying to reach you.

How it works:

You can use your telephone without missing other calls. A special tone alerts you to a waiting call; the person calling you hears normal ringing.

To answer a waiting call:

- 1. When you're on the phone, a special tone tells you a second call is waiting.
- Simply press and quickly release the "switchhook" on your telephone. Your first caller is automatically placed on hold, while you're connected with the second caller.

If you choose not to answer the incoming call:

1. You'll hear a special tone to remind you of the waiting call.

To alternate between callers:

 Simply press and quickly release the "switchhook." While you talk with one caller, the other will automatically be placed on hold. Each conversation remains private.

To end either call:

Hang up.

- 2. Your phone will ring.
- 3. When you answer; you'll be connected with the remaining caller.

Cancel Call Waiting

To "turn off" Call Waiting before making a call:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *70. (On a rotary phone, dial 1170.)
- 3. Listen for the confirmation tone.
- 4. Dial the telephone number you wish to call. Now, your call will not be interrupted by the Call Waiting tone. Other callers will hear a busy signal.
- 5. After you hang up, Call Waiting automatically "turns on" again.

To "turn off" Call Waiting during a call:

- 1. Press and release the "switchhook."
- 2. Press *70. (On a rotary phone, dial 1170.)
- 3. Listen for the confirmation tone. You'll automatically be reconnected to your call.
- 4. After you hang up, Call Waiting automatically "turns on" again.

Note:

- You must have Three-Way Calling to "turn off" Call Waiting during a call.
- The "switchhook" is the button the handset pushes down when you hang up the phone. Some telephones have a Link or Flash key you can press instead.

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Warm Line

Be Prepared for emergency situations

How it works:

Help is not far away-even when you can't dial the phone. Your telephone can automatically dial an emergency number for you.

To use:

- 1. Lift the handset and wait 30 seconds.
- 2. The pre-designated number is automatically dialed. This number is:

To prevent automatic dialing:

 Begin dialing within 30 seconds after lifting the handset.

Note:

 You must select the telephone number to be dialed when you sign up for Warm Line service. To change this number, contact your local telephone company.

Teen Line/Distinct Ring

Know who the call is for-as soon as it rings!

How it works:

Two different phone numbers can be assigned to your home telephone line. Use one number for the adults...a separate number for the children. You can answer the phone differently for different callers.

To use:

- When someone dials your main telephone number, you'll hear normal ringing (one long ring).
- When someone dials the other telephone number, you'll hear a special ring that identifies that number (such as two short rings).
- Wait until the full ring pattern is complete before answering. You'll know whether the call is for you-and how you should greet the caller.

If you also have Call Waiting:

 If someone dials your main number while you're on the phone, you'll hear a normal Call Waiting tone. If someone dials one of the other numbers, you'll hear a special Call Waiting tone that identifies that particular number (such as two short tones).

Note:

Only one conversation can be held at a time. Although you have more than one telephone numbers you still have just one line.

Three-Way Calling

Talk with two people in different places-at the same time.

How it works:

When you're talking with someone, you can add a third person to the call. It's easy to coordinate family schedules or hold a telephone conference with business colleagues.

To add a third person to the call:

- Press and quickly release the "switchook" to place the first person on hold.
- 2. Listen for the dial tone.
- Dial the third person's phone number. (If you have speed calling, you may dial one of your codes instead.)
- When the third person answers, you can talk privately before making it a three way conversation.
- To make the three-way connection, press and quickly release the "switchhook." You can now talk with both people at the same time.

To cancel the three-way connection:

- If the third person did not answer or you wish to disconnect them, just press and quickly release the "switchhook." You'll be reconnected to the person holding.
- Or, either of the two people hang up, you can continue talking with the remaining person.

To end the call completely:

1. Simply hang up.

Note:

*The "switchhook "is the button the handset pushes down when you hang up the phone. Some telephones have a Link or Flash key you can press instead.

Speed Calling 8

Quickly dial eight of your most frequently called numbers.

How it works:

You can enter up to eight telephone numberslocal or long distance-into your Speed Calling list. Then, you can reach those people by dialing just one digit.

To program your Speed Calling list:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *74. (On a rotary phone, dial 1174.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.

SALLING SERVICES

- 4. Dial a one-digit speed code. (Choose any number, 2 through 9.)
- Dial the telephone number you wish to assign to that speed code. (For long distance calls, be sure to include "1" plus the area code.
- 6. Press the # key. (On a rotary phone, wait four seconds after dialing.)
- 7. Listen for the confirmation tone.

To call someone on your Speed Calling List:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Dial the one-digit speed code, then press the # key. (On a rotary phone, wait four seconds after dialing.)

To change your Speed Calling list:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *74. (On a rotary phone, dial 1174.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- 4. Dial the one-digit speed code you wish to change.
- Listen for the cancellation tone, then the dial tone. Follow steps 4-7 above to program your Speed Calling list.

Speed Calling 30

Quickly dial 30 of your most frequently called numbers.

How it works:

You can program up to 30 telephone numberslocal or long distance-into your Speed Calling list. Then, you can reach those people by dialing just two digits.

To program your Speed Calling list:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *75. (On a rotary phone, dial 1175.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- 4. Dial a two-digit speed code. (Choose any number, 20 through 49.)
- Dial the telephone number you wish to assign to that speed code. (For all calls be sure to include "1" plus the area code.)
- 6. Press the # key. (On a rotary phone, wait four seconds after dialing.)
- 7. Listen for the confirmation tone.

To call someone on your Speed Calling list:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- Dial the two-digit speed call then the # key. (On a rotary phone, dial the two-digit speed code, and wait four seconds.)

To change your Speed Calling list:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *75. (On a rotary phone, dial 1175.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- Dial the two-digit speed code you wish to change.
- Listen for the cancellation tone, then the dial tone. Follow steps 4-7 above to program your Speed Calling list.

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Communicating at the speed of "CLICK"

Call Return

Easily dial your last caller - even if you didn't answer.

How it works:

If you couldn't get to the phone in time, you can still find out who called. Return the call by dialing a simple code.

How to Use:

- Lift the handset and listen for a normal dial tone.
- If you were already on the phone and ignored a call waiting tone, press and quickly release the "switchhook."
- 3. Press *69. (On a rotary phone, dial 1169.)

If the line is busy:

- 4. Hang up. Your phone will keep trying the line for up to 30 minutes.
- A special callback ring alerts you if the line becomes free. (Some phones ring normally.)
- Lift the handset to automatically place the call.

To cancel your Call Return request:

- 1. Press *89. (On a rotary phone, dial 1189.)
- Listen for the confirmation tone or announcement. Hang up.

Note:

- The "switchhook" is the button the handset pushes down when you hang up the phone.
 Some telephones have a Link or Flash key you can press instead.
- In some areas, after you dial *69, a recorded voice will give you the phone number of the call you missed and ask if you want to use the Call Return feature. Just follow the voice instructions.
- Does not work on 800 numbers, 900 numbers, outside the specific service area, or lines where Call Forward and some other call services have been activated.

Repeat Dialing

Get through to busy numbers as soon as they're free.

How it works:

You can save time dialing busy numbers over and over. Your phone rings you as soon as the line is free, and automatically connects you.

How to Use:

- When you hear a busy signal, press and release the "switchhook." Listen for a special tone.
- 2. If you've already hung up, lift the handset and listen for a normal dial tone.
- 3. Press *66. (On a rotary phone, dial 1166.)
- 4. If the line is still busy, hang up. Your phone will check the number for up to 30 minutes.
- A special callback ring alerts you if the line becomes free. (Some phones ring normally.)
- Lift the handset to automatically place the call.

To cancel your Callback request:

- 1. Depress the "switchhook" and release. Listen for a special dial tone.
- 2. If you've already hung up, lift the handset and listen for a normal dial tone.
- 3. Press *86. (On a rotary phone, dial 1186.)
- 4. Listen for the confirmation tone or announcement. Hang up.

Note:

- To start the 30-minute clock, repeat steps 1-4 under "How to Use."
- Repeat dialing can check as many as 31 busy lines at once for you. To know which is being completed, you must subscribe to Caller I.D. service.
- The "switchhook" is the button the handset pushes down when you hang up the phone.
 Some telephones have a Link or Flash key you can press instead.

Communicating at the speed of "CLICK"

Private Call Rejection

Refuse calls from those who have blocked their numbers.

How it works:

When you've turned this service "on" any callers who have blocked their number from your Caller ID display will hear an announcement that you do not accept anonymous calls - and they should remove Blocking and call back. All other calls will ring through as usual.

To "turn on" the service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *77. (On a rotary phone dial 1177.)
- 3. Listen for the confirmation tone or announcement. Hang up.

To "turn off" the service:

- 1. Press *87. (On a rotary phone, dial 1187.)
- 2. Listen for the confirmation tone or announcement. Hang up.

Note:

 You will not be notified when or how many calls have been rejected.

Selective Call Acceptance

Decide which calls you'll take.

How it works:

You can program your phone to accept only those calls from a special list of people. When your service is "turned on", your phone will accept only calls from those in your Selective Call Acceptance list. All others will hear an announcement that you're not accepting calls at this time.

To "turn on" service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *64. (On a rotary phone, dial 1164.)

- Listen for an announcement telling you whether the feature is currently on or off. The recorded voice will then tell you how many (if any) numbers are currently stored in your acceptance list.
- 4. Follow the voice instructions and dial 3 to turn the feature ON. (if it is currently off), or turn the feature OFF (if it is currently on).

To add the last caller to your acceptance list:

1. Press #01#. (On a rotary phone, dial 1201.)

To hear the phone numbers on your list:

- 1. Dial 1.
- After the list is read, voice instructions will follow.

To add a number to your list:

- 1. Press #. (On a rotary phone, dial 12.)
- Follow the voice instructions you'll hear. You can store up to 31 phone numbers on your list.

To remove a number from your list:

- 1. Press *. (On a rotary phone, dial 11).
- Follow the voice instructions to remove any or all of those numbers.

To hear instructions again:

1. Dial 0.

Notes:

- You may press 1, 0, #, or * at any time rather than waiting for the voice instructions.
- The list you create here is separate from any other lists you may be using for Priority Ringing, Preferred Call Forwarding, Call Rejection, and similar services.

Call Rejection

Don't let unwanted calls disturb you.

How it works:

You can program your phone to reject calls from any number you place in the rejection list. When your service is turned "on" any callers in this list will hear an announcement that you're not accepting calls at this time. All other calls will ring through as usual.

How to use:

- Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *60. (On a rotary phone, dial 1160.)
- Listen for an announcement telling you whether the feature is currently on or off. The recorded voice will then tell you how many (if any) numbers are currently stored in your rejection list.
- Follow the voice instructions and dial 3 to turn the feature ON (if it is currently off), or turn the feature OFF (if it is currently on).

To add the last caller to your rejection list:

1. Press #01#. (On a rotary phone, dial 1201.)

To hear the phone numbers on your list:

1 Dial 1

After the list is read, voice instructions will follow.

To add a number to your list:

- 1. Press #. (On a rotary phone, dial 12.)
- Follow the voice instructions you'll hear. You can store up to 31 phone numbers on your list.

To remove a number from your list:

- 1. Press *. (On a rotary phone, dial 11.)
- Follow the voice instructions to remove any or all of those numbers from your rejection list.

To hear instructions again:

1. Dial 0.

Notes:

- You will not be notified when or how many calls have been rejected.
- You may press 1, 0, #, or * at any time rather than waiting for the voice instructions.
- The list you create here is separate from any other lists you may be using for Priority Ringing, Selective Call Acceptance, Preferred Call Forwarding, and similar services.

Communicating at the speed of "CLICK"

Priority Ringing

You'll know when someone special is calling.

How it works:

When you make a list of special callers your phone uses a special ring to announce calls from any of those numbers. If you also have Call Waiting, you'll hear a special Call Waiting tone.

How to use:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *61. (On a rotary phone, dial 1161.)
- Listen for an announcement telling you whether the feature is currently on or off. The recorded voice will then tell you how many (if any) numbers are currently stored in your list.
- Follow the voice instructions and dial 3 to turn the feature ON (if it is currently off), or turn the feature OFF (if it is currently on).

To add the last caller to your forward list:

1. Press #01#. (On a rotary phone dial 1201.)

To hear the phone numbers on your list:

- 1. Dial 1.
- After the list is read, voice instructions will follow.

To add a number to your list:

- 1. Press #. (On a rotary phone, dial 12.)
- Follow the voice instructions you'll hear. You can store up to 31 phone numbers on your VIP list.

To remove a number from your list:

- 1. Press *. (On a rotary phone, dial 11.)
- 2. Follow the voice instructions to remove any or all of those numbers from your list.

To hear instructions again:

1. Dial 0.

Notes:

- You may press 1, 0, #, or * at any time rather than waiting for the voice instructions.
- The list you create here is separate from any other lists you may be using for Selective Call Acceptance, Preferred Call Forwarding, and similar services.

Call Forward Busy

When your line is busy, your callers can reach someone else.

How it works:

Whenever you're on the phone, you can be sure your callers can talk with someone else or can leave a message for you. Easily turn it on or off, or change the forwarding number-anytime.

To "turn on" the service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *90. (On a rotary phone, dial 1190.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- 4. Dial the number where you want your calls forwarded.
- 5. When the phone is answered, your Call Forward is in effect.

If the line is busy, or there's no answer:

6. Hang up.

CALLING SERVICES

Within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4
above. You'll hear a confirmation tone to
let you know your Call Forward Busy is
now working.

To "turn off" the service:

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *91. (On a rotary phone, dial 1191.)
- Listen for the confirmation tone, then hang up. Your Call Forward Busy is now "off".

To change the "forward to" number:

- 1. Turn off Call Forward Busy, (see prior directions).
- Repeat the previous steps to turn on Call Forward Busy, entering the new "forward to" number.

Note:

Dial the number exactly as if you are calling directly. For all calls, dial "1" plus the area code. Or if you have speed calling, you may dial one of your codes instead.

Call Forward No Answer

Whenever you can't answer, forward your calls to someone who can.

How it works:

If you can't get to the phone, you can be sure that your calls won't go unanswered. You can easily change the forwarding number — even choosing how many times your phone should ring.

To "turn on" the service:

- Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *92. (On a rotary phone, dial 1192.)
- 3. Listen for the dial tone.
- Dial the number of rings (from 2 to 9) to be allowed before the call is forwarded. Then dial the number where you want your calls forwarded.
- When the phone is answered, your Call Forward No Answer is in effect.

If the line is busy, or there's no answer:

- 6. Hang up.
- Within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4 above. You'll hear a confirmation tone to let you know your Call Forward No Answer is now working.

To "turn off" the service:

- Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *93. (On a rotary phone, dial 1193.)
- Listen for the confirmation tone, then hang up. Your Call Forward No Answer is now "off".

To change the "forward to" number:

- 1. Turn off Call Forward No Answer, (see prior directions).
- Repeat the previous steps to turn on Call Forward No Answer, entering the new "forward to" number.

Note:

 Dial the number exactly as if you are calling directly. For all calls, dial "1" plus the area code. Or if you have speed calling, you may dial one of your codes instead. **CALLING SERVICES**

Preferred Call Forwarding

Decide which callers should follow you to another number.

How it works:

You can program your phone to forward only those calls from a special list of numbers to another number - such as your car phone. When your service is turned "on", calls from numbers in your forward list will be re-routed to your "forward-to" number. All others will ring at your phone as usual.

How to use:

CALLING SERVICES

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *63. (On a rotary phone, dial 1163.)
- Listen for an announcement telling you whether the feature is currently in your forward list.
- Follow the voice instructions and dial 3 to turn the feature ON (if it is currently off), or turn the feature OFF (if it is currently on).

To add the last caller to your forward list:

1. Press #01#. (On a rotary phone, dial 1201.)

To enter your "forward-to" number:

- The first time you turn on the service, you'll be asked to enter the number you'd like your special calls forwarded to. From then on, the system will simply remind you of the current "forward-to" number.
- 2. If the current number is correct, dial 1.
- If you wish to change the current "forward-to" number, dial 0 then follow the voice instructions.

To hear the phone numbers on your list:

- 1. Dial 1.
- 2. After the list is read, voice instructions will follow

To add a number to your list:

- 1. Press #. (On a rotary phone, dial 12.)
- Follow the voice instructions you'll hear. You can store up to 31 phone numbers on your list.

To remove a number from your list:

- 1. Press *. (On a rotary phone, dial 11.)
- 2. Follow the voice instructions to remove any or all of those numbers from your list.

To hear instructions again:

1. Dial 0.

Notes:

- You may press 1, 0, #, or * at any time rather than waiting for the voice instructions.
- The list you create here is separate from any other lists you may be using for Priority Ringing, Selective Call Acceptance, Call Rejection, and similar services.
- This service can work with Call Forward (all calls). Numbers on your preferred list will follow you to your Preferred Call Forward number. All other calls will be routed to your regular Call Forward number.

Caller ID

See the number calling before you answer the phone.

How it works:

When you receive a call, the number of the person calling you is shown on your Caller ID display screen.

How to use:

- When you receive a call, wait until your telephone completes the first ringing signal.
- The telephone number of the person calling you will automatically appear on your display screen.
- 3. If you choose to answer the call, the number will remain on the screen until you or the caller hangs up.

Note:

- Subscription to Calling Number requires the lease or purchase of a display telephone or an add-on display unit.
- If the letter "P" or "Private" appears on your screen, the caller may have blocked the display of their number by pressing *67 (or dialing 1167 on a rotary phone) before placing the call. You can choose whether or not to answer the call.
- If "unknown name", "unknown number", "out of area", or "0" appears, the caller is in an area that does not support Calling Number services.

Call ID on Call Waiting

This service is an enhancement you may add to your current service. When your call waiting "beeps", you will be able to see who is calling on your Caller ID box. You must subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting to use this feature. Some Caller ID boxes may not be compatible with this service.

Caller ID W/Name

See who's calling you before you answer the phone.

How it works:

When you receive a call, the name and number of the person calling you is shown on your Caller ID display screen.

How to use:

- When you receive a call, wait until your telephone completes the first ringing signal.
- The telephone number calling you-and the name associated with that number in telephone company records-will automatically appear on your display screen.
- If you choose to answer the call, the number will remain on the screen until you or the caller hangs up.

Note:

- Subscription to Calling Name and Number service requires the purchase of a display telephone or an add-on display unit.
- If a letter "P" or "Private" appears on your display after the first ring, the caller may have blocked the display of their name and number by pressing *67 (or dialing 1167 on a rotary phone) before placing the call. You can choose whether or not to answer the call.
- If "unknown name", "unknown number", "out of area", or "0" appears, the caller is in an area that does not support Calling Number services.

Per Line Blocking

Certain customers can request to have their line automatically block the transmission of their number to Caller ID users. This service is available upon request to victims of domestic abuse, law enforcement agencies, fire departments, social service agencies and similar organizations.

Per Call Blocking

Block your number from being displayed to others (No Charge To Use)

How it works:

By dialing a code before you place a call, you can prevent your phone number from appearing on the Caller ID display of the person receiving your call.

How to use:

CALLING SERVICES

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for the dial tone.
- 2. Press *67. (On a rotary phone, dial 1167.)
- 3. Dial the number you're calling as usual.
- 4. The person you've called will not be able to see your number displayed on their telephone display screen. Instead, a "P" or "Private" will be displayed.

Note:

· You must dial *67 before each call you place. Otherwise, your phone number will be released to the person receiving your call.

Call Transfer

Easily transfer a call to someone else

How it works:

You can transfer a call to another number or add a third person to a call. When you're ready to hang up, the other two people can continue their conversation.

To transfer a call:

- 1. Press and quickly release the "switchhook" to place the person you are talking with on hold.
- 2. Listen for the dial tone.
- 3. Dial the third person's phone number. (If you have speed calling, you may dial one of your codes instead.)
- 4. When the third person answers, you can talk privately before making it a three way conversation.
- 5. To complete the transfer, press and quickly release the "switchhook". You can now talk with both people at the same time.
- 6. Hang up. The other two people can continue their conversation.

To cancel the transfer:

1. You can cancel the transfer at any time-If the third person did not answer, you receive a busy signal or recording, or you wish to cancel the transfer after talking to the third person. Just press and quickly release the "switchhook" twice. You'll be reconnected to the person holding.

Note:

- Any chargeable or long distance calls you place for the transfer or three-way conversation will be billed to your number.
- The "switchhook" is the button the handset pushes down when you hang up the phone. Some telephones have a Link or Flash key you can press instead.

Voice Mail

Dial *98 or the voice mail access number is 715-684-MAIL (715-684-6245) from your home phone to get into voicemail system. Your mail-box number is the telephone number for which the mailbox has been set up. When setting up your mailbox, the technician will assign a default password of 1234. You may program your own password once your mailbox has been established. We do encourage you to use your own password for security reasons.

To find out if you have new messages in your voice mailbox, simply lift the handset of your phone and listen to the dial tone. If you hear a "stuttered" dial tone and then a regular dial tone, you have new messages. If you listen and just hear the regular dial tone, you have no messages in your mailbox.

To hear your messages from your own phone, dial **715-684-MAIL** and select from the menu options given.

To hear your messages from another phone, dial **715-684-MAIL**. Enter your **mailbox number** (your telephone number), followed by "#". Then enter your **password**, followed by "#".

If you are calling for your messages from a phone within our exchange area that also has voice mail, follow these instructions. Dial your home phone number. When the voice mail answers, press"*". Then enter your **password**, followed by "#".

Voicemail to Email: Baldwin LightStream is now offering voicemail to email service. The price is only \$2 a month and the customer provides Baldwin LightStream with an email address. The messages will still be accessible from your telephone, but you can listen to them anytime you log onto your email. Please contact Baldwin LightStream for more information on this service.

Reset Number of Rings

To change the number of rings, listen for dial tone then:

- 1. *93 then hang up. Lift receiver again.
- 2. *92 Pause 3 seconds.
- 3. Number of desired rings (such as 3 or 4).
- 4. 715-684-6245.

Call Forward- No Answer

You may program your voice mailbox to answer calls after a certain number rings (similar to an answering machine). When your phone rings that many times without being answered, calls will automatically be forwarded to your voice mailbox. When choosing the number of rings, please consider the following things:

- 1. The number of rings chosen must be greater than 1.
- 2. Many callers will hang up after about 5 rings.
- If you allow for three or four rings, you can leave this feature on at all times and still allow yourself enough time to answer incoming calls when you want.
- 4. If you want to call from one extension to another extension in your home (e.g. from the house to the barn or vice versa), you must make sure this feature is off. If the feature is on, your call will automatically go to your voice mailbox.

To turn this feature on, take your phone off the hook and press the following keys:

- 1. *92 Pause 3 seconds.
- 2. Number of desired rings (such as 3 or 4).
- 3. **715-684-6245.**

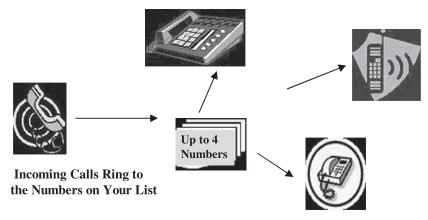

EQUIPMENT

Customer Owned Equipment

You may choose to purchase your own telephone terminal equipment. You are responsible for maintenance or replacement of such equipment. In the event there is a service problem and a serviceman is dispatched to your home or business and finds the trouble is in your equipment, repairs will be made and a service charge will be billed to you.

TELEPHONE SAFETY

The telephone is one of the safest appliances in your home or office. There are, however, a few situations where a telephone user needs to be cautious.

Use of the Telephone Near Water

The telephone should not be used while you are in the bathtub, shower or pool. Immersion of the telephone or handset in water could cause electrical shock.

Use of the Telephone During an Electrical Storm

You should avoid using a telephone or online modem during an electrical storm in your immediate area; calls of an urgent nature should be brief. Although Baldwin LightStream uses protective measures to limit abnormal electrical surges from entering your home, absolute protection is impossible. There is a remote risk of a dangerous electrical shock from lightning when using telephone equipment during a nearby electrical storm.

Use of the Telephone to Report a Gas Leak

If you think you've found a gas leak, you should <u>NOT</u> use a telephone in the vicinity of the leak until the leak is repaired. The telephone contains electrical contacts that could generate a tiny spark when you lift the handset and dial. While unlikely, it may be possible for this spark to trigger an explosion if the gas concentration is high enough.

Telephone Damage

Some telephones and communications equipment may be damaged due to uncontrollable electrical surges.

INSTRUCTIONS AND STANDARDS FOR SIMPLE INSIDE WIRING PROCEDURES ARE AVAILABLE FROM BALDWIN LIGHTSTREAM.

The Telephone Industry is in a constant state of change. Some changes affect how your local service is provided while other changes affect long distance service. Although Baldwin LightStream may be unable to notify you of all changes that could affect you, Baldwin LightStream personnel are always happy to answer questions you may have.

Before Calling for Repairs

Try to locate the problem before calling the Repair Service. Here are some tips to help determine the source of the problem, save time and help avoid a possible service charge. Please note: customer caused outages may result in charges, when a technician is dispatched after regular business hours.

Self Check

REPAIR SERVICE INFORMATIO

Use these simple tests to determine if the problem is in your phone or in the phone lines.

- 1. Unplug the phone, answering machines, satellite receiver or computer modem from the outlet and plug in a phone that is working correctly. If the problem goes away, it is a problem with your equipment.
- 2. If the problem continues, you can test the line by connecting directly to a Network Interface Device (NID) located where the telephone line enters your premises. A flat head screw driver will allow you to open the front cover of the NID to access the test jack. Unplug the test jack and wait five minutes for the system to rest. Then plug in your working phone into the test jack. If the phone operates, there is a problem with the wiring that runs from the NID to your telephone jacks. (Remember to put back the test jack plug when finished.) If

the phone does not work, please contact Baldwin LightStream Repair Service at 715-684-3400 to report the problem.

Service

When you have a service problem, we'll do our best to locate and clear up the trouble. Depending on the source of the problem, the following guidelines apply:

- Outside Line: Baldwin LightStream maintains the line that runs up to the NID as part of your basic monthly rate.
- Inside Wire: Inside wiring is any wire that runs from the NID to the telephone jacks. Most inside wire is run inside the walls, but may also be run on the outside of the house especially in older homes. You are responsible for the repairs to the inside wiring. You will be billed for the repairs or you may hire another vendor.
- Telephone: When you own your own telephones, you are responsible for repair of the phone and should follow the warranty instructions.

WARNING TO TELEPHONE CUSTOMERS

Unlawful Use of Telephone: Harassing or Threatening Calls:

Making threatening, tormenting, obscene, harassing or nuisance calls including but not limited to improper debt collection is a violation of state (Wis. Stat. 947.01) and federal law (see, 47 U.S.C. 203, 233).

Wisconsin state law provides that anyone knowingly using their telephone or allowing their telephone to be used with the intent to frighten, intimidate, threaten, abuse or harass may be subject to fines or imprisonment or both. These same penalties apply to anyone making calls that threaten to inflict injury to persons or property, calls that use obscene or profane language or suggest lewd acts, or repeatedly making calls to a number, whether or not a conversation occurs.

Bomb Threats:

Bomb threats are prohibited and are subject to serious penalties including fines, imprisonment or both.

Telephone Fraud:

Obtaining telecommunications services by fraud or under a false name or charging long distance calls to a number other than your own are illegal and may be punishable by significant fines, imprisonment or both (See, Wis. Stat. 943.45).

Emergency Calls:

Wisconsin state law (Wis. Stat. 941.35) provides, in part, that a Party line subscriber must yield or surrender use of their line to another person in order for that person to report a fire, summon the police, medical or other aid on an emergency situation. Failure to surrender, the line will result in fines. It is also illegal to request the use of a Party line under the pretext that an emergency exists. The law (Wis. Stat. 941.35(1)(a) defines "emergency" as: a situation in which property or human life is in jeopardy and the summoning of aid is essential.
