Do you know CPR?

CPR for Adults

- 1 Make sure the scene and area around the person is safe.
- 2 Tap the person and talk loudly: "Are you okay?"
- 3 Yell for help. Use a cellphone to call 911 and send a bystander to get an AED.
- 4 Check the person's breathing.
- 5 If the person is not responding, breathing, or only gasping, start CPR.
Give 30 compressions at a rate of 100-120 beats per minute and at a depth between 2-2.4 inches (5-6 cm). Let the chest rise back up before you start your next compression.
- 6 Open the airway and give 2 breaths.



CPR for Children

- 1 Make sure the scene and area around the child is safe.
- 2 Tap the child and talk loudly: "Are you okay?"
- 3 Yell for help.
- 4 Check breathing.
If not responding and not breathing or only gasping, then give 5 sets of 30 compressions and 2 breaths.
- 6 Call 911 and get an AED.
- 7 Resume CPR and give compressions and breaths.



 Continue giving compressions and breaths until the EMS arrives.

Compression for Adults

- 1 Position the person on their back on a firm, flat surface.
- 2 Remove or open up clothing at the neck and chest area.
- 3 Feel for the end of the breastbone (sternum).
Place the heel of one hand on the lower half of the breastbone. Avoid pressing down on the very end of the breastbone as the bony tip, called the xyphoid process, may break off and slash the liver, resulting in internal bleeding. Put the other hand on top of the first.
- 4 Press straight down at a rate of 100-120 beats per minute and at a depth between 2-2.4 inches (5-6 cm).
Let the chest recoil completely between compressions.
- 6 Your hands should remain in contact with the person, without bouncing or leaning on the person.



Performing proper CPR is often tiring. Ask to switch positions when tired if another rescuer is available to help. Monitor each other's performance, providing encouragement and offering to switch when fatigue sets in.

Compression for Children

- 1 Position the child on their back on a firm, hard surface.
- 2 Move any clothing away from the chest.
- 3 Place the heel of one hand on the lower half of the breastbone.
Push straight down approximately at least one third the depth of the chest. In most children this will be about 2 inches (5 cm). Compressions should be delivered at a rate of 100-120 beats per minute.
- 5 Let the chest recoil to its normal position after every compression.



- * Either one-handed or two-handed compressions can be used in child CPR.
- * Performing CPR can be tiring! If someone is available to help, change rescuer positions.

How to Use an AED

- 1 Turn the power on
- 2 Expose the chest
- 3 Apply pads on the victim
- 4 Connect the pads
- 5 Clear the person
- 6 Analyze the rhythm
- 7 Follow the prompts

First Aid for Choking

Choking (Adult)

If a choking person can speak, breathe or cough – **STAND BY and encourage coughing.**

If a conscious person cannot speak, breathe or cough:

- 1 Stand behind person and find top of the hip bones with your hands.
- 2 Place a fist midline against the abdomen.
- 3 Grasp fist with other hand and press inward and upward forcefully.
- 4 Continue until object is expelled or person becomes unconscious.



FIND TOP OF HIPBONES



PLACE FIST MIDLINE ON ABDOMEN



PRESS INWARD AND UPWARD

If the person becomes unconscious ease him or her to the ground and send for medical help

- 1 Open the mouth and look for obstruction.
- 2 Open the airway and check breathing. If not breathing...
- 3 Give two breaths. If air doesn't go in the first time, reposition the head and try again.
- 4 Begin CPR. Give 30 compressions.
- 5 Each time you finish 30 compressions, look in mouth before giving the first breath.

Choking (Child)

If a choking child can speak, breathe or cough – **STAND BY** and encourage coughing.

If a conscious child cannot speak, breathe or cough:

- 1 Stand behind the child and find top of the hip bones with your hands.
- 2 Place a fist midline against the abdomen.
- 3 Grasp fist with other hand and press inward and upward forcefully.
- 4 Continue until object is expelled or child becomes unconscious.



PLACE FIST MID-LINE ON ABDOMEN

If the child becomes unconscious ease him or her to the ground and send for medical help

- 1 Open the mouth and look for obstruction.
- 2 Open the airway and check breathing. If not breathing...
- 3 Give two breaths. If air doesn't go in the first time, reposition the head and try again.
- 4 Begin CPR. Give 30 compressions.
- 5 Each time you finish 30 compressions, look in mouth before giving a breath.



MAKE A FIST



THRUST INWARD AND UPWARD

Choking (Infant)

If infant is making high pitched noises or is having trouble breathing:

- 1 Give 5 forceful blows between the shoulder blades.
- 2 Turn infant over and give five chest thrusts using two fingers on the infant's breastbone just below the nipple line.
- 3 Repeat 5 back blows and 5 chest thrusts .
- 4 Continue until object is expelled or child becomes unconscious.



5 BACK BLOWS

If the infant becomes unconscious place him or her on a firm flat surface and send for medical help

- 1 Open the mouth and look for obstruction.
- 2 Open the airway and check breathing. If not breathing...
- 3 Give two breaths. If air doesn't go in the first time, reposition the head and try again.
- 4 Begin CPR. Give 30 compressions.
- 5 Each time you finish 30 compressions, look in mouth before giving a breath.

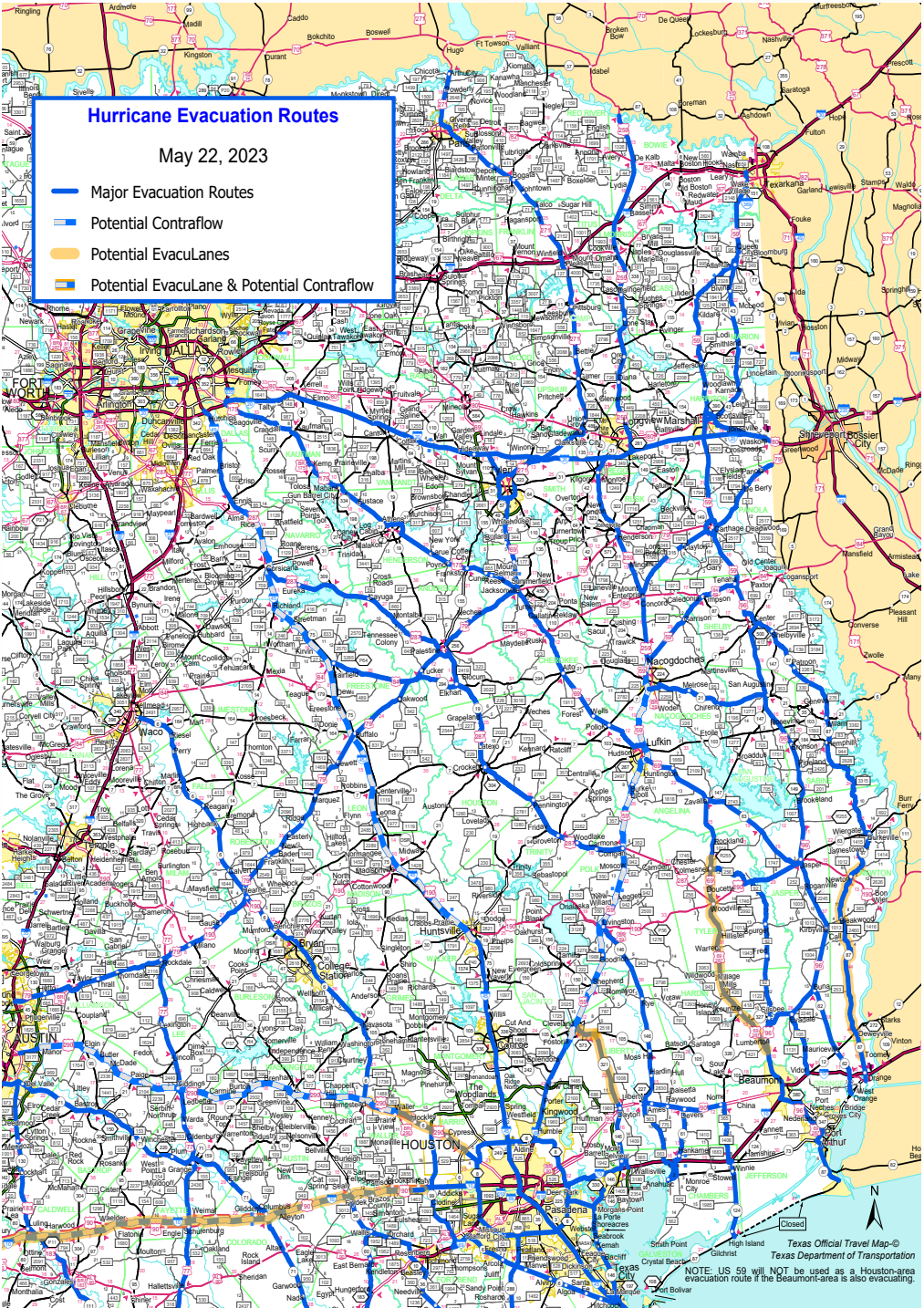

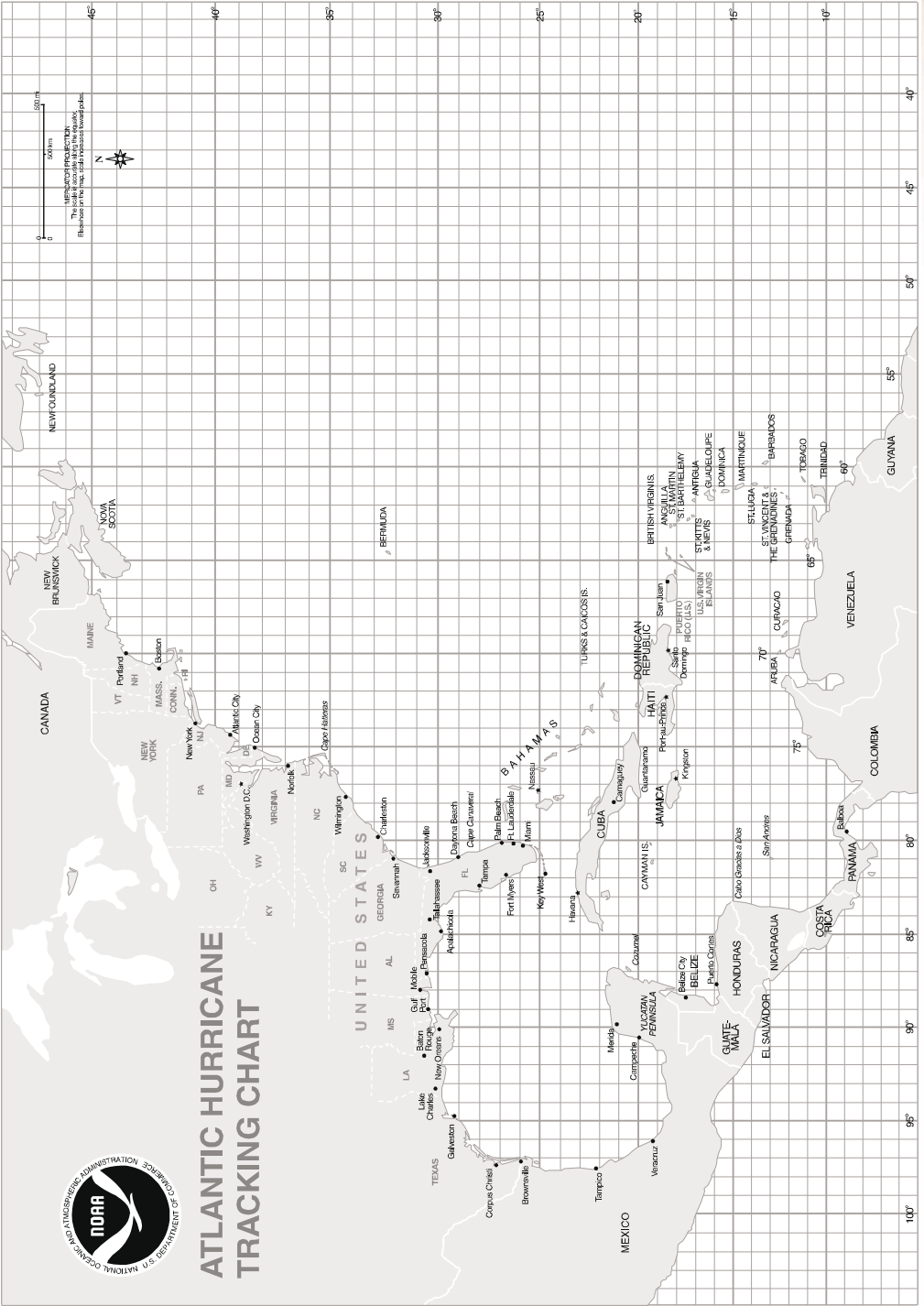

“Home of the Redbud Festival”



BUNA, TEXAS. Buna is at the junction of Farm roads 253 and 1004, U.S. Highway 96, and State Highway 62, thirty-six miles north of Beaumont in south central Jasper County. The Beaumont Lumber Company mill in southern Jasper County was first called Carrola for the Carroll family, prominent Beaumont lumbermen and industrialists. The site was subsequently renamed Buna, however, in honor of one of the family’s cousins, Buna Corley. A post office was established there in 1893. With substantial operations in Jasper County underway by 1890, the Beaumont Lumber Company built a tram road from Buna to Ford’s Bluff, on the Neches River. John Henry Kirby later bought the ten-mile-long tram line and by 1896 had converted it to a common carrier and extended it to Beaumont in the south and Roganville in the north. The revamped railroad was called the Gulf, Beaumont and Kansas City. Buna’s economic position was solidified in 1902, when the Orange and Northwestern Railway linked the logging town with Orange. Four years later the Orange and Northwestern was extended from Buna to Newton. A townsite situated between the two railroad lines was platted on July 21, 1916. Although the region’s economy suffered as the virgin forests were reduced, in later years second-growth timber continued to provide local jobs. In addition to logging, farming remains important to local residents. Numerous oilfields, first discovered in 1948, lie to the west and north of Buna and further augment the local economy. The weekly East Texas News was founded at Buna in 1967. The population of Buna was estimated at 650 in the early 1940s, 1,650 by the early 1970s, 2,000 in 1985, and 2,127 in 1990. In 2000 the population was 2,269.

“... A GOOD PLACE TO LIVE”

KIRBYVILLE, TEXAS. Kirbyville began as a dream of John Henry Kirby who purchased 276 acres from Texas Tram and Lumber Company to lay out a townsite in late 1894. He hired Captain E.T. Kellie of Jasper to survey and plot the town which was named for Mr. Kirby.

Mr. Kirby's railroad, Gulf, Beaumont and Kansas City Railroad, extended just past what is now known as Main Street in Kirbyville. On May 1, 1895, following extensive advertising in most East Texas cities, approximately 1,000 people met the train carrying an eleven piece band from Beaumont and many excited passengers. Under a large tent the auction of the city lots began and so began the city of Kirbyville.

Kirbyville, which celebrated its Centennial in 1995, nestles in the piney woods of Deep East Texas between the gently flowing Trout Creek to the north and Pin Oak Creek to the south. The city lies near the Big Thicket National Preserve and owes its beginning and its continued existence to the timber and paper industries.

The citizens who reside in the Kirbyville area enjoy the rich history of the town and experience the distinct advantage of a scenic rural life but knowing that other worlds are near at hand: large metropolitan areas to the south and the vast lake areas of Sam Rayburn, Toledo Bend and Steinhagen Lake to the north. Also, the Sabine River is not far to the east and the Neches River is only twelve miles to the west. Kirbyville is only forty-two miles from the deep water port of Beaumont, Texas.

Year-round, the natural resources that surround Kirbyville play host to an abundance of activities.

Nearby state and national forests provide hiking, camping and nature exploration. Fresh water lakes, streams and rivers provide swimming, fishing and nautical pleasures; and the nearby Gulf Coast has deep sea fishing and beachcombing.

Several festivals occur annually including the Magnolia Festival and Christmas in the Park.

Many areas are set aside for hunting and game is plentiful including deer, turkeys, squirrels, quail, doves, raccoons and rabbits. Kirbyville itself is a bird sanctuary and provides much enjoyment to bird watchers.

RECREATION:

Lake Sam Rayburn Just a few minutes northwest of Jasper, Lake Sam Rayburn is the crown jewel of recreation in the Jasper-Lake Sam Rayburn Area. The largest lake in Texas, Lake Sam Rayburn is comfortably located approximately halfway between the cities of Beaumont and Longview and runs 79 miles long. Lake Sam Rayburn was named the #1 bass fishing lake in the United States in 2018! The lake is the perfect place for a variety of activities. Residents and vacationers alike flock to Lake Sam Rayburn for popular outdoor fun in fishing, boating, waterskiing, kayaking, wakeboarding and swimming. For those who prefer to stay dry and still have a good time... camping, bird watching, golfing, and hiking are among the most common attractions.

Martin Dies, Jr. State Park

Martin Dies, Jr. State Park, is a 705-acre recreational area in Jasper and Tyler Counties between Woodville and Jasper on B.A. Steinhagen Reservoir (15,000 acres). Visitors can enjoy camping, hiking, boating, canoeing, fishing, swimming, mountain biking, wildlife and bird watching. There are canoes, bicycles, flat-bottom boats, volleyballs, and horse shoes for rent. There are naturalist activities on the weekends and outdoor educational facilities. Canoe trips down the Angelina or Neches River are taken on the third Saturday of every month, except in August. Call the park in advance to make reservations for scheduled canoe trips.

Birding For the birding enthusiast, there are a vast array of birds on the Big Thicket Loop for all seasons. You can journey through Sam Rayburn, Boykin Springs, Jasper State Fish Hatchery, Martin Dies, Jr. State Park, and B. A. Steinhagen Lake. You can catch a glimpse of the bald eagle, red headed woodpecker, blue jays, humming-birds, mocking birds, and various other beautiful feathered friends.

Boykin Springs Located on Boykin Springs Lake in the Angelina National Forest, this recreation area offers a little of everything, including camping, hiking, fishing, picnicking and relaxing in nature.

Jasper County Historical Museum

The Jasper County Historical Museum provides the Jasper area with information about Jasper’s very interesting history. They are open Wednesday – Saturday, 10 am to 3pm and located on the square in Downtown Jasper.





Jasper Arboretum & Outdoor

Learning Center This 14-acre complex features several park areas sponsored by a coalition of organizations and the City of Jasper. Sandy Creek runs through the center of the park from Hwy 96 to the scenic stone-arched Main Street bridge. The north bank features formal gardens, children’s Kiwanis Park, and Library Gardens (dry garden, rose garden and butterfly garden). The newest addition to the park is the Master Gardener greenhouse and Outdoor Learning Center. In front of the greenhouse is a pergola with brick patio and swings, a favorite lunchtime stop for downtown Jasper. Behind the greenhouse is a potting shed/classroom overlooking Sandy Creek, where other sometimes play. Next to the greenhouse is the Butterfly Gardens. In partnership with our Fall Butterfly Festival, these beautiful creatures are released the third Saturday in October. There is now a permanent Butterfly House where children can get a closer look at the life cycle of the Monarch butterfly.

Shopping If the outdoors doesn’t appeal to you, Jasper has plenty of unique shopping to offer. From antiques to gifts and hunting and fishing equipment you’ll find something for everyone on your list.

Golfing Jasper has two golf courses for those golfing enthusiasts. Country Club RV and Event Center offers a 9-hole golf course with 3,221 yards of golf from the longest tees for a par of 36 and Rayburn Country Club offers a newly renovated 18 holes of championship golf course featuring 150 feet of elevation into the tall stately pines of East Texas with new greens, tees, bunkers and manicured fairways for golfers of all levels.

THE ARTS:

East Texas Regional Art Center The East Texas Regional Art Center hosts a new exhibit each month, at no cost to the public. The center is also home to the TJ Art Fine Arts Academy for Home Schooled Students. The center offers day and evening classes in watercolor, oil, pastels and ceramics, along with various workshops and lectures. The center features a fine gift shop with handmade jewelry, small works of art and pottery. Artists can find a library of periodicals, books on art history and reference guides. Kountze

“Home of the **BIG Thicket**”



KOUNTZE, TX. Highway 69 runs through Kountze, which is the county sea of Hardin County. Two entrepreneurial brothers who were contemporaries and competitors of Arthur Stilwell and “Bet A Million” Gates founded Kountze in 1881. Herman and Augustus Kountze were Nebraska bankers and founders of the Sabine and East Texas railroad. They also had vast timber holdings in Southeast Texas. In 1881 their railroad bypasses the old county seat of Hardin in favor of their newly established town of Kountze, two miles east of Hardin. As a result, Kountze became the county seat of Hardin County around 1886. The brothers donated the land for the new Hardin County Courthouse in 1904.

Kountze became an incorporated city in 1947. The average annual rainfall is fifty-three inches. The average low temperature is 42 in January and the average high is 93 in July. Major employers are KISD, Hardin County Courthouse, Brookshire Brothers and Newark Paperboard Cores. In 2002, the city of Kountze constructed a new public library facility. A city park offers a walking track, children’s playground and covered pavilion.

The Big Thicket National Preserve, which boasted 300,000 visitors in 2020, is located in and around the Kountze area. The numerous nature trails of the Preserve are crowded each year enthusiastic hikers and off road bikers. The Big Thicket Visitor Center is approximately five miles north of Kountze on the Big Thicket Preserve Parkway. Pristine sand-beached Village Creek, near Kountze, offers summer canoing, fishing, kayaking and boating adventures. In addition, the Kountze area offers excellent birding opportunities. The American Bird Conservancy has designated The Big Thicket National Preserve a “Globally Important Bird Area”. The more sought after birds are the Red Cockaded Woodpecker, the Brown-Headed Nuthatch, & the Bachman’s Sparrow.

NEWTON COUNTY

“CLEAN AIR - FRESH WATER - FRIENDLY PEOPLE”

The state legislature marked off Newton County on April 22, 1846, from the eastern half of Jasper County and named it in honor of John Newton, a veteran of the American Revolution. Newton County is located in southeastern Texas on the Louisiana border and is the longest and easternmost county in Texas. The City of Newton is the geographic center and largest town of the county. The county comprises 950 square miles of the lower regions of the East Texas timber belt. Capitalizing on the region's huge expanses of virgin forests, large timber interests became involved in Newton County during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Throughout the years with proper forest management and reforestation programs, the county's available timber resources have been rejuvenated. By 1990, forestry was the main agricultural activity in the county. Common trees include longleaf and shortleaf pines, oak, magnolia, hickory, redbuds, dogwood and cypress. The rolling terrain is dominated by loamy topsoils. Oil and gas dominate the county's mineral resources. Rainfall averages just over fifty-four inches annually, the highest for any county in the state.

Newton is truly a historian's dream. A "must see" is the History Center & Museum. The Center is widely recognized for its definitive Genealogical Library, artifacts, archives and family collections. You will experience the bygone days of the East Texas Sawmills, as well as other events and people that have contributed to the proud history of the City and County since 1846. You can take self-guided tours throughout the area and visit distinctive historical churches, landmarks, historical markers and 120 cemeteries.

The Powell Hotel was originally the W.H. Ford Male and Female College. It was located at the site of the old high school on East Main Street. Built in 1889, it served as a co-educational college. Sold to Joseph & Minnie Powell in 1914, the building was converted into a hotel. The Powell family operated the Powell Hotel until 1954. In 1999, the Powell heirs deeded the hotel and property to the Newton County Historical Commission to be restored and serve as a museum that would represent the education and culture of Newton County beginning in 1889.

The Historic 1902 Newton County Courthouse, the 'hub' of the city, was devastated by a fire on August 4, 2000. As the citizens of Newton watched it burn, thoughts of rebuilding were already in their minds! Only the four walls were left standing and through the efforts of the County Judge and the community, a grant from the Texas Historical Commission was obtained and the structure is being restored to the original design!

The City of Newton is aggressive in assisting existing businesses and potential new businesses. In 1994, the Newton Economic Development Corporation and the Newton Community Development Corporation were formed. New and existing businesses requesting economic assistance have discovered that working with the City of Newton is easier and more timely than many other larger communities. The economic assistance request package is moved through promptly and with an earnest desire to help that business in its efforts to move to Newton. Today, many families and businesses find Newton County an attractive area to relocate. Life moves a bit slower, but the labor force is plentiful and market values of land and homes are traditionally lower than property in neighboring counties. Our Newton City & County governments are committed to the promotion of high quality services and economic development and to an ongoing improvement in the quality of life for its citizens.

Newton also offers family recreation at the Pete Hughes Memorial Park and Caney Creek Park. The Hughes Park provides a complete playground facility and is conveniently located across from the Newton County Public Library. The Caney Creek Park located at the intersection of U.S. Highway 190 and State Highway 87 provides a one mile plus walking trail that winds along the creek and around a pond under antique light poles. During the month of December, the park is home to a fantastic display of Christmas lights, which can be seen from the Christmas Train! The new Welcome Center Depot will host the Christmas Train & all other festivities of the season. The Fair Grounds hosts the Newton County Livestock Show in the Spring and is home to several other events promoted year 'round. In the fall, the Newton Ex-Students Association sponsors its annual Homecoming Parade and Bazaar on the Courthouse Square. If you would like to experience business owners calling you by name, an outstanding school district, church and spiritual foundations and abundant recreational opportunities, the City of Newton welcomes you to be part of its family of residents!

Sabine County

DISCOVER SABINE COUNTY – When we cross the Pendleton Bridge joining Louisiana and Texas we will be traveling on Texas Hwy 21, also known as “El Camino Real de los Tejas”. This part of the highway has been designated as a National Historic Trail with an active history of at least 300 years. The water below us is the Toledo Bend reservoir. It’s the largest body of water in the South and a world class fishing lake. Since 1969 this reservoir has covered 65 miles of the original water course of the Sabine River.

As we enter Texas our first stop will be the Historic Gaines-Oliphint House located in the Pendleton Harbor Subdivision just a mile on our right. This Pre-republic Anglo, double pen, planked log, story and a half, structure is acknowledged by the Texas Historical Commission as the oldest standing hand hewn log structure in the state. The Daughters of the Republic of Texas have restored the main structure as it stands within a two-acre fenced property.

As we return to the El Camino Real Historic Trail, we turn right-West and continue for 7 miles to the intersection with Hwy 87. On the NW corner of the intersection you will find El Camino Park and the original site of the courthouse square of “Red Mound”/Milam. The US Post Office here was the “first” registered in the state of Texas. The small, reconstructed, Causey Cabin dates to 1837 and is open on the weekend before Thanksgiving every year during Milam Settlers Day.

Continuing West on Hwy 21 and taking the turn toward Geneva and San Augustine, you will pass a Historical marker noting the largest and earliest Spanish land grant in Sabine County. In a few miles, on your left, you will see the sign for the “Lobanillo Swales”. This is the location of the finest historic Wagon Tracks in the country. The tracks are certified by Archeologists as more than 300 years old.

Continuing along this Historic Trail, you will find the marker leading to the original location of the 1883 Oldest Protestant congregation in the State of Texas, McMahon Chapel Methodist Church. At this site is the current chapel structure, museum, and historic cemetery.

Now that we have covered Hwy 21/El Camino Real de los Tejas East to West in Sabine County, let us return to the intersection with Hwy 87 and turn right toward Hemphill, the county seat of Sabine County since 1852. In Hemphill we will find the “Remembering Columbia” NASA Museum. This museum is the most sought after location for visitors in all of Sabine County. On February 1, 2003, the Columbia Shuttle broke up during re-entry and came down largely in Sabine County. This museum tells the story of the Shuttle program, STS 107, those lost, and the miracle that united all of

As we leave Hemphill traveling West on Hwy 83/ Worth Street, we will pass some of the original antique housing built for the local lumber mill. Lumber was and still is a major contribution to the economy in these Piney Woods.

Down the road is another 10 miles is Pineland, the only other incorporated town in Sabine County. Pineland was born as a mill town and still has that claim to fame. In the beautiful park where Pineland Days takes place, every other year, we will find ample evidence of the Historic past.

SILS BEE

A PLACE TO GROW



SILS BEE, TEXAS. The genesis of Silsbee can be traced to the timber and railroad industry. In 1893, a young Houstonian named John Henry Kirby came to East Texas with a vision of capitalizing on the vast timber resources found within the area. He wasted no time in organizing a group of investors to help accomplish this dream. One investor, Nathaniel D. Silsbee, realized that the town's first major obstacle was the lack of a rail system in the eastern part of Hardin County. With this in mind Kirby and Silsbee began the construction of the Gulf, Beaumont and Kansas City Railroad from the city of Beaumont to be completed at the city of San Augustine. After the completion of the railroad, Kirby sold it to Santa Fe Railroad Company. The developing town was eventually named Silsbee after Nathaniel D. Silsbee.

Silsbee, the principal commercial center of Hardin County, is located at the edge of the Piney Woods region about fifteen miles northeast of the Port of Beaumont on the Texas Gulf coast and is within easy driving distance to the Houston metropolitan area. Nestled in the piney woods of Southeast Texas, deep within the Big Thicket National Preserve, Silsbee offers a hometown atmosphere with modern conveniences set in one of the most beautiful natural environments in Texas. Any season is a great time to canoe the densely forested sections of Southeast Texas. Each season brings its own splendor to the Piney Woods and the Big Thicket. It has landscape filled with natural beauty and wildlife. There is so much to discover here!

TYLER County

“The Dogwood Capital of Texas”

TYLER, TEXAS. TYLER COUNTY. (J-22) is in southeastern Texas near the Louisiana border. Woodville, the county seat and largest town, is fifty-six miles north of Beaumont and ninety miles northeast of Houston, very near the center of the county at 3047' north latitude and 9425' west longitude. Tyler County is bounded on the north and east by the Neches River. The county comprises 908 square miles of the East Texas timberlands, an area densely forested with pine and a great variety of hardwoods. It contains two units and parts of two more of the twelve units of the Big Thicket National Preserve established by Congress in 1974. The land is gently rolling, with an elevation ranging from 100 to 400 feet above sea level. Northern and eastern Tyler County is drained to the Neches River via Caney, Russell, Billiams, Pamplin, Wolf, Theuvenins, and Rush creeks. The southwestern part of the county contains numerous springs and drains into Horsepen, Hickory, Turkey, and Cypress creeks. The largest body of water in the county is B. A. Steinhagen Lake on the Neches River, impounded in 1951 by Town Bluff Dam (also called Dam B); the lake covers 13,700 acres.

The area of Tyler County was for centuries occupied by agricultural Caddoan, and possibly Atakapan, Indians. White settlers there in the early nineteenth century encountered both Caddoan-related Cherokees uprooted from the east and groups of Alabama and Coushatta Indians, recent migrants from Louisiana. In 1809 there were hundreds of Alabama Indians living on the west bank of the Neches River, three leagues above the junction of the Neches and Angelina rivers. At Peach Tree Village in Tyler County, their principal Texas settlement, the Alabamas kept cattle, horses, and hogs and cultivated corn, potatoes, beans, and yams. The Cherokees were eventually driven from the state by order of Mirabeau B. Lamar, but the Alabamas and Coushattas cooperated with Sam Houston and others friendly to their cause and have survived as one of only two Indian groups living on their own reservations in Texas. The Alabama-Coushatta Reservation is just across the western Tyler County line in Polk County. The settlement by whites of what was to become Tyler County began before the time of the Texas Revolution in 1836. Three Americans received land grants there from Mexican authorities in 1834, and thirty-four more men and one woman, Jane Taylor, received grants during 1835. The area was originally organized in 1842 under the name of Menard District, “for judicial and other purposes,” from a part of Liberty County. Tyler County was officially established by the Texas legislature on April 3, 1846, and was named in honor of President John Tyler.

When you visit, you will find southern hospitality from our citizens and southern beauty from our large forests and sparkling lakes for camping, fishing and swimming. Our rolling hills give magnificent views of tall pine trees interspersed in the spring with blooming dogwood and redbud trees.

SAM RAYBURN RESERVOIR

Sam Rayburn Reservoir is a reservoir in the United States in Deep East Texas, 70 miles north of Beaumont. The reservoir is fed by the Angelina River, the major tributary of the Neches River. The Reservoir is upstream of the Big Thicket National Preserve.

Twenty-two maintained access areas (including parks and private concessions) are located around the reservoir. Boat ramps are available at each of these areas. Some ramps may be unavailable for use when the lake is low, so it's a good idea to check with local authorities for current water levels and ramp conditions. Thirteen parks are operated by the Corps of Engineers, and the rest by the US Forest Service, Texas Parks & Wildlife Department, or county. Five access areas are operated by concessionaires or located in close proximity to a concession/marina. Camping is allowed at some access areas. Contact operating agency for availability of electrical outlets, drinking water, sanitary and shower facilities.

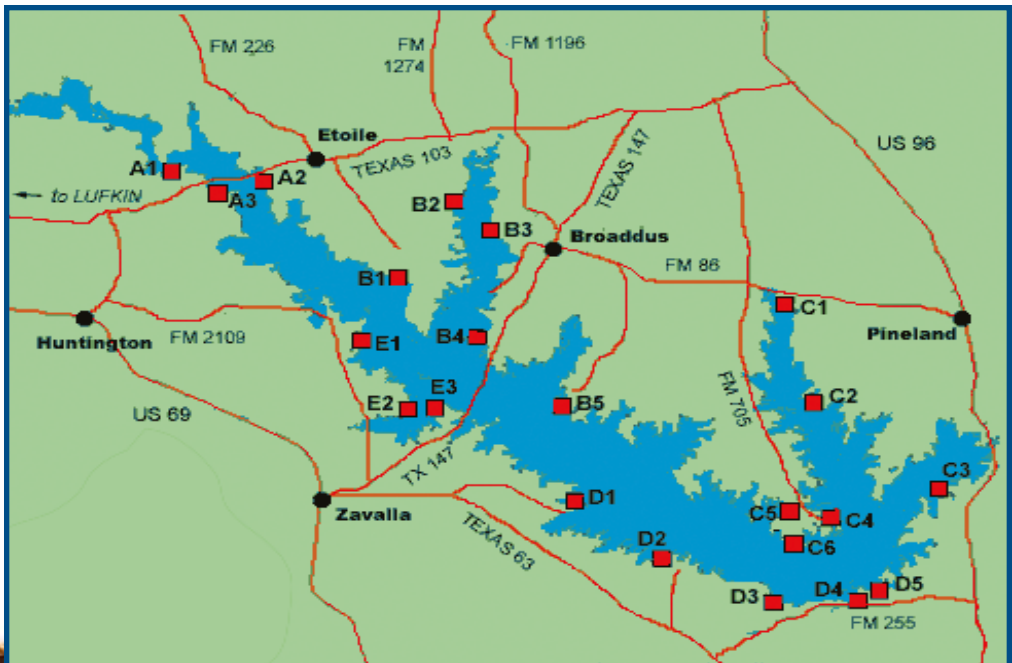

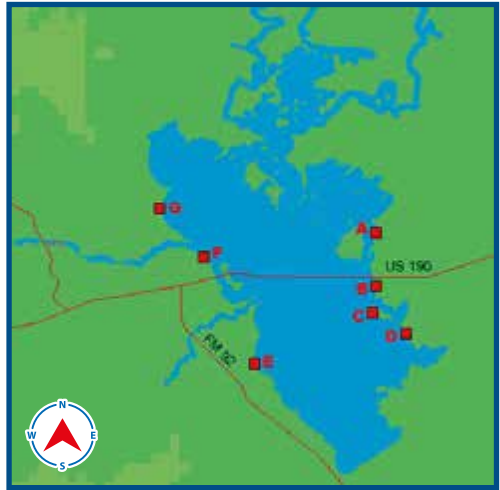

TOLEDO BEND RESERVOIR



Toledo Bend Reservoir is a reservoir on the Sabine River between Texas and Louisiana. The lake has an area of 185,000 acres, the largest man-made body of water partially in both Louisiana and Texas, the largest in the South, and the fifth largest by surface acre in the United States.

Approximately 33 public access areas (parks, commercial facilities and marinas) are located on the Texas side of the reservoir. Boat launching facilities are provided at most access areas. The Sabine River Authority of Texas operates 11 access areas; the rest are private concessions. Many areas offer camping; check with the operating agency for each site for information about electrical hookups, drinking water, sanitary and shower facilities.
